The parents, students, and staff of the General Philip Kearny School, partnered together to develop this school-parent compact for achievement. Parents are encouraged to attend annual revision meetings held during the spring of each year to review the compact and make suggestions based on student needs and school improvement goals. General Philip Kearny Elementary School GOALS

At least 70% of Kindergarten, 50% of 1st grade, and 42% of 2nd grade students will score at target by Spring STAR assessment.

2. No more than 20% of 6th-8th graders will score below basic on the Math PSSA.

3. At least 43% of students will attend 95% of days or more with no more than 15% of students who will attend less than 85% of school days.

4. No more than 20% of 6th-8th graders will score below basic on the ELA PSSA

5. At least 60% of Kindergarten, 70% of 1st grade, and 70% of 2nd grade students

will make at least one year's worth of growth, as evidenced by their independent reading level from Q1 to Q4.

6. No more than 25% of 3rd grade students will score Below Basic on the 3rd grade ELA and MATHEMATICS PSSA

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

General Philip Kearny Elementary School will:

Identify targeted students to participate in summer bridge activities. All parents are invited to participate in literacy workshops during which reading strategies to use at home will be shared along with strategies to strengthen mathematics skills as well.
Provide workshops/monitoring to parents to keep them informed of their child's success and areas where support is needed.
Provide parent meet and greet opportunities with principal.
Open House/Back to School Night including Annual Title I Meeting.
Parents are provided with training on how to use our reading intervention program at home.
Parents will be offered opportunities to learn about the proper use of technology to be able to assist students at home using technology.
School library will provide more resources for students and families
Provide Scholastic Bookfair for students and families March 2025

• Parents will conference on the child(ren)'s academic progress three times a year. Kearny will work to coordinate conferences at different times of day in order to best accommodate the schedules of parents/families.

- The Back to School Night and the Annual Title I Meeting will occur in September 2024
- Parents will be provided with Interim reports.

• Parents will receive information about reading and math tests, benchmarks, and most recent *PSSA*.

• *IEP meetings will be conducted annually.*

• Newsletters, fliers, Robo-calls, & the Parent Portal are used regularly to communicate with parents. All communication with parents is in parent-friendly language in English and Spanish, as appropriate. Other language translations are available through the office of translation services

ACTIVITIES TO BUILD PARTNERSHIPS:

General Philip Kearny Elementary School offers ongoing events and programs to build partnerships with families

- Provide parents with reasonable access to staff. The staff can share their email with parents.
- Parent teacher conferences will be scheduled and conducted upon written or verbal

request. Conferences can be scheduled before and after school and during a teacher's

prep period. Classroom visits may be arranged by appointment and will last for 15-30 minutes maximum without disruption, contact, or conversation.
