# Academic Highlights

#### Math

Imagine Learning Illustrative Mathematics (IM) became our primary instructional material last year. As we continue with year 2 of use, we will continue to build mathematical thinkers through student-centered learning. The IM program supports the belief that we are all mathematical thinkers, and we learn math by doing math – by solving problems and engaging in rich discourse with our peers. In this program the focus is on understanding the concepts behind the math problems, rather than just memorizing steps and formulas. Students will learn to think critically and solve problems using logic and reasoning, not only to find the right answer but to also explain how they got there.



#### **Social Studies**

The Philadelphia School District's Social Studies program is designed to create students who can think critically. The curriculum is inclusive and culturally responsive. Students are encouraged to value their own cultural identities and uplift the cultural identities of others. Our students will acquire the skills and tools necessary to solve problems, communicate ideas, and challenge oppressive systems. As well as develop meaningful relationships with land, nature, and people in order to make principled, ethical decisions and work collectively toward creating a truly just society.

## NURSE'S NOTES

Reminder that the Flu season is here and students should stay home if they are having symptoms. They should also be free of fever or symptoms without the use of medicine within a 24 hr period.

The Norovirus (Stomach bug)-Highly contagious, leads to diarrhea, vomiting and abdominal pain. The virus spreads easily and quickly and it's advised to stay home with the above mentioned symptoms.
